No person shall stop, park or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, at any time at the following location on Winona County State Aid Highway No. 15:


County State Aid Highway No. 15, in the City of Winona, Minnesota beginning at its junction with County State Aid Highway No. 17 Easterly to its junction with Clubview Road and there terminating.

As a means of notifying the public of the provisions of this ordinance the Winona County Highway Engineer is authorized and directed to paint and erect signs as per the standards on painting and the erection of signs which are contained in the Uniform Manual of Traffic Control Devices.

It is a petty misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than \$100 for any person to violate any provisions of this ordinance. A person charged with a violation of this ordinance is not entitled to a jury trial, but shall be tried by a judge without a jury. If convicted, he is not subject to imprisonment **but** may be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.00.

In addition, a peace officer is hereby authorized to move a vehicle to any public garage or other place of safety at the expense of the driver or owner or other person in charge of the vehicle when the vehicle has been parked or left standing in violation of this ordinance. A vehicle so removed shall be released to the driver or the owner or other person in charge of the vehicle only upon the payment of any reasonable charges made for towing and storage.
